

Summer 2003 Classes for Children and Teens

Six week class programs

Class Descriptions

Introduction to POTTERY

Basic skills for working with clay: potter's wheel, hand building, coil making, slab construction, beginning glazing and firing. Students will make various items to take home such as a mug, a piggy bank & mirror frame. (Projects will differ for students who have already completed the introductory class and who are attending the Creativity Camp program, unless they wish to repeat projects.). **MONDAYS June 23-July 28, 10 a.m.-noon**

Introduction to PAINTING

Basic skills and introduction to various painting media, composition. Students will learn basic sketching and color skills using watercolor and acrylic media. They will take home many sketches, self-made color wheels, watercolor compositions and a final acrylic painting on canvas. **MONDAYS June 23-July 28 1-3 p.m.**

Introduction to DRAWING

Practice with various drawing media such as pencil, charcoal, pastels and drawing skills such as line quality, proportion, perspective, balanced composition. Students will take home daily sketches which include in-studio compositions and outside natural compositions. Class open to beginners as well as students with some basic experience who wish to further their skills. **TUESDAYS June 24-July 29 10 a.m.-noon**

Intermediate POTTERY

This class will build on skills learned in the introductory class. Completion of Intro. To Pottery required. Students will use skills to make larger pottery items such as bird bath and more intricate projects such as statues and larger pots. (Students who are attending the Creativity Camp program will receive special help in completing these projects if they have not yet completed the introductory class). **TUESDAYS June 24-July 29, 1-3 p.m.**

Introduction to QUILTING

Instruction and safety tips on using cutting instruments, iron, needles. Skills include identifying different types of fabric and threads, needle threading, basic hand stitches and quilting stitches, iron-on appliqué, & taking accurate measurements. Students will take home various self-made projects such as pin cushion, wall quilt, and other items to decorate their rooms. No machine sewing in this course. These skills are enjoyed by boys and girls. **WEDNESDAYS June 25-July 30, 10 am-noon.**

DRAWING PEOPLE

For beginners and experienced students. Focus is on proportion of face and body as well as drawing still life and body in motion. Students will take home daily sketches of realistic and cartoon characters. Final projects will be drawing of person in favorite sport or activity and a self portrait . **WEDNESDAYS June 25-July 30, 1-3 p.m.**

SEWING BASICS

Basic hand stitches for constructing fabric creations, cutting and care of various fabrics. Students will complete various projects such as pillow, decorative wall hangings, and t-shirt embellishment. Students need to bring a white prewashed t-shirt to class. No machine sewing included. **THURSDAYS June 26-July 31, 10 a.m.-noon.**

PAPER PROJECTS AND SCRAPBOOKING

Various techniques for using paper to create cards, scrapbooks, and other projects. Materials include LOTS of kinds of paper, paper punches, stamps and colored ink, stickers, and other media. Students will take home self-made cards and posters, a mini-scrapbook, and other projects. Students will be making a "theme" scrapbook. They will need to bring a collection of photos (or copies of photos) that fit a theme of their choosing such as pet, vacation, sport, dance, school friends, etc.

THURSDAYS June 26-July 31, 1-3 p.m.

CRAFTS

Working with wood, paper, paints, papier mache, beads, wire, and other media to create crafty projects for decorating home, garden, YOURSELF! Students will take home projects which include decorated trinket boxes, homemade paper projects, and wearable art. **FRIDAYS June 27-August 1 (class will not meet July 4th), 10 a.m.-noon.**

CRAFTY RECIPES

Fun recipes for snacks and crafts. Students will collect recipes (in a self-made recipe box!) of fun things to make using everyday ingredients found in the home. Students will take home recipe box and recipes which include homemade clays and paints, sidewalk chalk, creative crayons and soaps and other fun creations.
